### THE SCHOOL

ETAP- Escola Profissional was created in 1989 and it is one of the oldest and most prestigious professional schools in the country. It was the first to be created in the North region and the second nationally.

It organises initial education and training courses for young people and has six Training Units - Caminha, Vila Praia de Âncora, Vila Nova de Cerveira, Valença, Viana do Castelo and Ponte de Lima - and in the Metropolitan Area of Porto - Maia Municipality.

Young people can complete their secondary level education and training pathway by choosing the vocational course that best suits their motivations and vocational centres of interest. Once completed, in a dual certification pathway, school and vocational, in our school, students can choose to enter the world of work with a level IV qualification from the European Union or continue their studies in higher education institutions, polytechnic or university, with good access conditions.

ETAP is also the promoter of three Qualifica Centres located in Viana do Castelo, Ponte de Lima and Caminha, where adults and young people/ adults can certify the academic and/or professional skills acquired throughout life in different contexts (formal, informal and non-formal) and through the most different life experiences.

ETAP Escola Profissional was a precursor in the implementation of quality management systems adapted to education and training institutions. It obtained the EQAVET seal of conformity awarded by ANQEP under the Quality Assurance System.

The trainees who attend professional courses at our school, in addition to the theoretical and practical training they receive throughout the three years of their courses, also take opportunity to participate on ERASMUS+ projects and internships in various European countries.

Throughout its history, ETAP Vocational School has trained thousands of young people and hundreds of adults in training areas such as hotel and tourism, construction and civil engineering, graphic arts, environment and natural resources, management, commerce, IT, design, multimedia, car mechatronics, fashion, sports, among many others, always recording high levels of satisfaction.

The current Educational Project of ETAP Vocational School, called "ETAP Odyssey 2030", seeks to give the necessary framework to its action, which has the central objective of preparing young people for entry into the labour market or for further studies, providing them with a set of soft skills that will enable their full integration into society and their success in the future.



### THE CITY

Viana do Castelo is the northernmost Atlantic city in Portugal, about 25 minutes away from the international airport of Oporto.

The visitors can enjoy a remarkable quality of life, either by the tranquillity and safety of its urban living, either by the richness of its natural, monumental and historical heritage, or, still, by the existence of excellent cultural, sport and social equipment.

The presence of the river, the mountains and the sea provide the city with excellent landscapes which enchant the senses, provide a psychological climate of relaxation and are conducive to the healthy and pleasant occupation of leisure time.

A set of modernised cultural spaces - theatres, cinemas, libraries, museums - provide cultural enrichment for residents and visitors, while the presence of the river and the sea offers special conditions for leisurely sailing and the practice of all types of water sports.

The unequalled wealth of Viana do Castelo's ethnography, which makes the city the capital of Portuguese folklore, the originality and functionality of its handicraft, with special emphasis on crockery and embroidery, the assiduous and qualified cultural entertainment, are other attributes that make Viana do Castelo an extremely attractive city for all types of Tourism.

### **DISCOVERING VIANA DO CASTELO**

Peddy paper activity with a pedestrian route to visit historic and cultural places.

This activity allowed the integration of the mobility participants and the group, composed by students from all nationalities, allowing them to live together while they worked together to get to know the cultural heritage of Viana do Castelo.

Above all, it was a lively and interesting activity, as we got to know some of our city's historical landmarks, such as:

The Chapel of Nossa Senhora da Agonia - the most famous of the four chapels erected on the hill formerly known as "Morro da Forca", together with the Chapel of Nossa Senhora da Conceição.

The Fountain at Praça da República - this is a Renaissance fountain and National Monument, the last of a set of three monumental projects made by the Porto stonemason João Lopes.

Santiago da Barra Fort - in a dominant position on the right bank of the river Lima's bar, its function was to defend the anchorage and settlement of Viana da Foz, currently Viana do Castelo.

The Port of Viana do Castelo - important since the Middle Ages, at the time of the Portuguese Discoveries, the port of Viana do Castelo is the third largest port in the country.



















### TRADITIONAL DINNER

Held in Quinta da Presa our traditional dinner where we presented and could taste some of the typical dishes of our rich gastronomic culture. It was also the opportunity to present, through the Folkloric Group of the Lavradeiras of Meadela, an impressive performance where dance, song and traditional music met to provide us with a true cultural show.

Besides the traditional instruments, the elements of the group presented themselves with the traditional clothes of our culture, a symbol of local identity, unique in the panorama of popular clothing in Portugal, easily recognised and identified with the region of origin.

After presenting the traditional costumes, the group explained in detail the differences between the various costumes presented, identifying the peculiar characteristics of each one, the differences according to the formality of the occasion, adapting it to the rhythms and moments of rural life of daily work, moments of rest, namely Sunday, and of celebration, where the girl showed herself proudly in her splendour.

### **CULTURAL VISIT / TRAIL**

It is time to see Viana do Castelo in a different way, to contemplate all the splendour of the city through an elevated panorama, the most beautiful views over Viana do Castelo.

We took the Funicular of Santa Luzia and, with a drop of 160 meters and taking between six to seven minutes, we covered the 650 meters until we reached the top of Santa Luzia. A curiosity, this is the funicular with the longest trip in the country.

We visited the Citânia de Santa Luzia, known locally as "old city", one of the best known castros in Northern Portugal and undoubtedly one of the most important for the study of Proto-History and the Romanisation of Alto Minho. Its strategic location allowed it not only to dominate vast areas of the riverside area, but also to control the movement of entrances and exits in the Lima mouth, which, in Antiquity, would have been navigable for most of its course.

We ended our cultural trail with a visit to the most charismatic temple of the city, the Santuário do Sagrado Coração de Jesus or Santuário de Santa Luzia, where the interior is spectacular, its surroundings majestic and possessing a zimbório, the highest point of Viana do Castelo, from where we could see a landscape of several kilometres, considered one of the most beautiful in the world, a unique view of the region, which aggregates 3 natural elements (sea, river and mountain), compiling in this way a unique image.



















### HOW TO TURN MY SMARTPHONE INTO A PROFESSIONAL CAMERA

Workshop provided by professional expert and teacher of the school, Flávio Cruz, which had the purpose of providing the participants with some techniques, plans and tips to take advantage of all the capabilities that a smartphone allows, as equipment for photographic and video registration.

After the workshop, we went to the north beach, Atlantic coast, where the participants put into practice the techniques and tips discussed in the workshop and where, besides the fantastic photographs, we admired the seashore on a sunny and warm morning.



















### **CMIA**


### ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING AND INTERPRETATION CENTER

We visited the CMIA - Centro de Monitorização e Interpretação Ambiental, an environmental monitoring and interpretation centre resulting from the restoration of the Azenhas de D.Prior Castelo where the natural estuaries of the river Limia are preserved. We had the opportunity to get to know the natural fauna and flora of the region.

In small groups, a peddy papper activity took place where we explored the diversity of plants and animals in the environment and the impact that human beings are causing to the environment.

Following the workshop promoted on the theme "How to turn my smartphone into a professional camera" we had the possibility to put what we learned into practice as the space is prone to good photos.


All in all, it was an activity in contact with nature.

We visited the São Bento station famous for its tile panels and a historical building.



### **Museum of Discoveries**


Our visit to this museum allowed us to learn about the history of Portuguese sailing, exploring voyages, ships, trade and colonies around the world, travelling back in time.

The World of Discoveries - Interactive Digital Exhibition, is a space that reconstructs the fantastic odyssey of the Portuguese navigators, who crossed oceans to discover an unknown world. Here we learn about the importance of the time and the history of Portuguese sailing and caravels.

We learned how a caravel was organised inside through full scale models, as if we were inside one.

Through a boat trip we saw and heard the history and the role that Portugal played in this process for centuries, creating new ocean routes and putting people, animals and plants in circulation all over the world.
